We created a live lounge studio and started the Sur Sangam programme, bringing together musicians and singers from across Hampshire. From this we created the Unity 101 Collective Band who performed our anniversary concert at the Central Hall.

Unity 101's African & Caribbean programme presenter, Keesha Edwards, won the Positive Role Model Award for Race, Religion & Faith at the National Diversity Awards.

We launched the Port Horizon project, funded by Heritage Lottery. It looks at the contributions of black and minority ethnic seamen in the two world wars and the nations created by us, their descendents, after World War 2.

We launched Unity Arts, a six-month pilot project funded by the Arts Council England. It focuses on Southampton's Caribbean, Punjabi & Pakistani communities, encouraging them to share their stories & memories of HOME.
